Club News:

Foundation Moment with Jeff Balzer:

Rotary has two kinds of grants. Most of our Clubs know what a District Community Grant is – those are the grants that help our clubs put in a park bench or enrich the community in some way. The Community Grants are usually no more than a thousand dollars. Then there are the "big" grants – called Global Grants. The minimum for these Grants is \$30,000. These grants are the type we used for The Water Project in Thailand and the Solar Suitcase. Last year, throughout the Rotary world only 1,306 Global Grants were given out totaling 86.7 million dollars. The Grants were distributed through Rotary's Areas of Focus: 483 were given for Disease Prevention and treatment —which was double the number for the next highest focus. 283 grants were given for water, sanitation and hygiene. The rest were distributed like this; 82 for peace projects, 102 grants for Mother and Child, 174 for Basic literacy and education and 182 grants for economic and community development.




Word of the Week with Steve Edson:

Feisty. In certain parts of the United States, most notably the South, the noun feist (pronounced to rhyme with heist) refers to a small dog used in hunting small game animals (such as squirrels). Also spelled fice or fyce, it comes from an obsolete term, "fisting hound," that derived from another obsolete term, fist, a verb that once meant "to break wind." The term feisty has come a long way from its flatulent origin, but its small-dog association still seems relevant: the term conveys the spunk and determination that one may associate with a dog that manages to make its presence known (either through its bark or its bite) despite its small size.
