Foundation Moment with Jeff Balzer:

Here's an update on the Solar Suitcase Project – In case you didn't know yet, the Solar Suitcase provides an independent light source to clinics in regions of poverty to aid in the safe delivery of babies. As of February 1st, 9 Suitcases at \$3000 each have been purchased by our district! The Rotary Club of Washington purchased the first suitcase. Also buying a suitcase were the Cambria County Blind Association, the Johnstown Interact Club, and the Rotary Club of Somerset. Currently, a Rotarian from Philadelphia is in Uganda helping to lay the ground work for the distribution of our suitcases.

Also backing the Project are our sister clubs in Monongahela, McMurray, Point Marion, California, Latrobe,



Waynesburg, Mt. Pleasant, Blairsville, Johnstown, Connellsville, Portage, and Uniontown. Thank you to all the supporters of this project. The District's goal for the year is 15 solar suitcases. The support of our Greensburg club is still needed.
